Petition of Ed. Getzendanner et al

To the Honorable Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity. The Petition of Edward T. Getzendanner and others Plaintiffs in the above entitled cause, respectfully represent unto your Honor:-

1st. That since the filing of the Bill of Complaint in the above entitled cause it has come to the knowledge of your petitioners, that one of the parties defendant in said cause, alleged by said Plaintiffs to be an adult and of full legal age, is not in fact an adult, but an infant of tender years.

2d. That the name of the party defendant referred to is Florence G. P. Hughes, an infant of 18 years of age residing in the city of Baltimore.

3d. That the Parents of the said Florence Genevieve Patten Hughes are both dead, and your petitioners are advised there is no legal Guardian.

Your Petitioners therefore pray for the following relief- 1st. That your Honorable Court may pass an order directing the Clerk to issue a summons to the Sheriff of Baltimore City Maryland, together with a copy thereof of said summons to be served on the said Florence G. P. Hughes, infant as aforesaid, and the said copy to be left with her.

2. And for such other and further relief as the Nature of Your Petitioners case may require. And as in duty bound we pray Wm Wilson, Sol for Petitioners

Ordered, this 21 day of January 1886, that leave is granted the complainants above petitioners to so amend their Bill of Complaint as to describe the said Florence G. P. Hughes as an infant and to have a summons and copy thereof served on the said infant as above prayed Jno Ritchie
