In pursuance of the annexed order of the Court and notice given me by the Solicitor for the Plaintiffs in the above entitled cause, I, C. Layton O. Keady one of the regular Examiners of said Court having met at my office on the 15th day of April A.D. 1885, and fixed Friday the 19th day of April A.D. 1885 at my office in Frederick City, as the time and place for taking the testimony in this cause, and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned, did then and there proceed to take the following testimony to-wit:—

The Plaintiffs filed with the Examiners as evidence Exhibits A, B, C, & D, which are herewith returned by said Examiners.

Edward T. Shriver, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the plaintiffs being duly sworn, and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Examiners, and herewith returned deposes and says:

To the 1st Interrogatory.

1st. Ans. My name is Edward T. Shriver, my age 55 years, I reside in Frederick County, and my occupation is that of a Miller

To the 2d. Inter.

2d. Ans. I know all the parties, and have a distinct recollection of all except Mary Bechtol and John her husband, and have known them for some years. I believe I have heard of the Bechtols in connection with the Getzendanners.

To the 3d. Inter.

3d. Ans. Yes, I have a slight recollection of him. He is dead long ago. He died in Frederick County, at his home place, many years ago.

To the 4th Inter.

4th. Ans. He left a Will.

To the 5th Inter.

5th. Ans. I look at Exhibit A, now shown me. I believe that said Exhibit is a certified copy of the last Will, and testament and codicil thereto of said John Derr Sr. deceased. I know of no subsequent alteration thereto.

To the 6th Inter.

6th. Ans. He did. He owned a large quantity of real estate situated in Frederick County I suppose it is now worth about \$100,000 per acre. I look at Exhibit A, B, C, D, and I believe that said Exhibits fully describe the real estate of which said John Derr Sr. died seized and possessed.

To the 7th Inter.

7th. Ans. Said John Sr. left a widow surviving him. She is now dead; she died about the year 1852; she died in Frederick County at the home place.

To the 8th Inter.

8th. Ans. He left children surviving him, as follows:— John Derr
