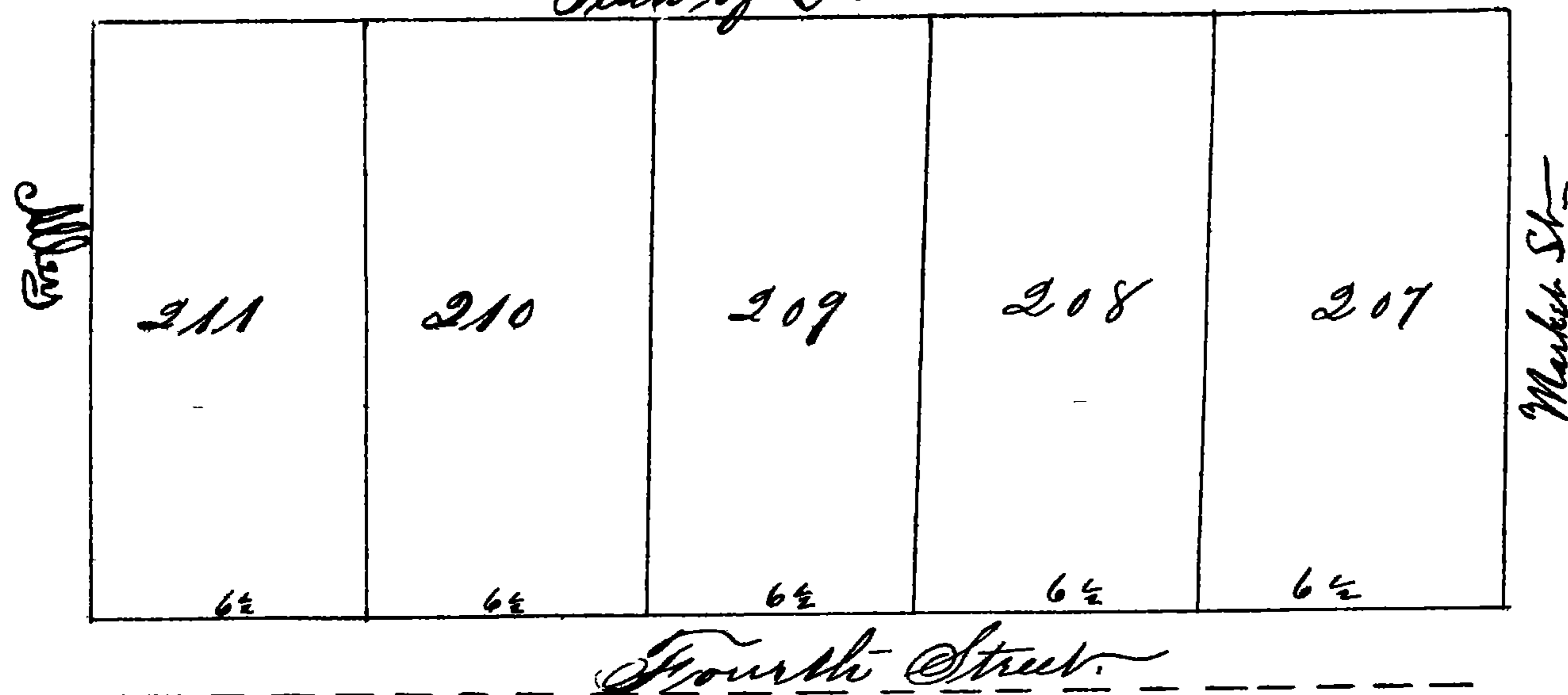
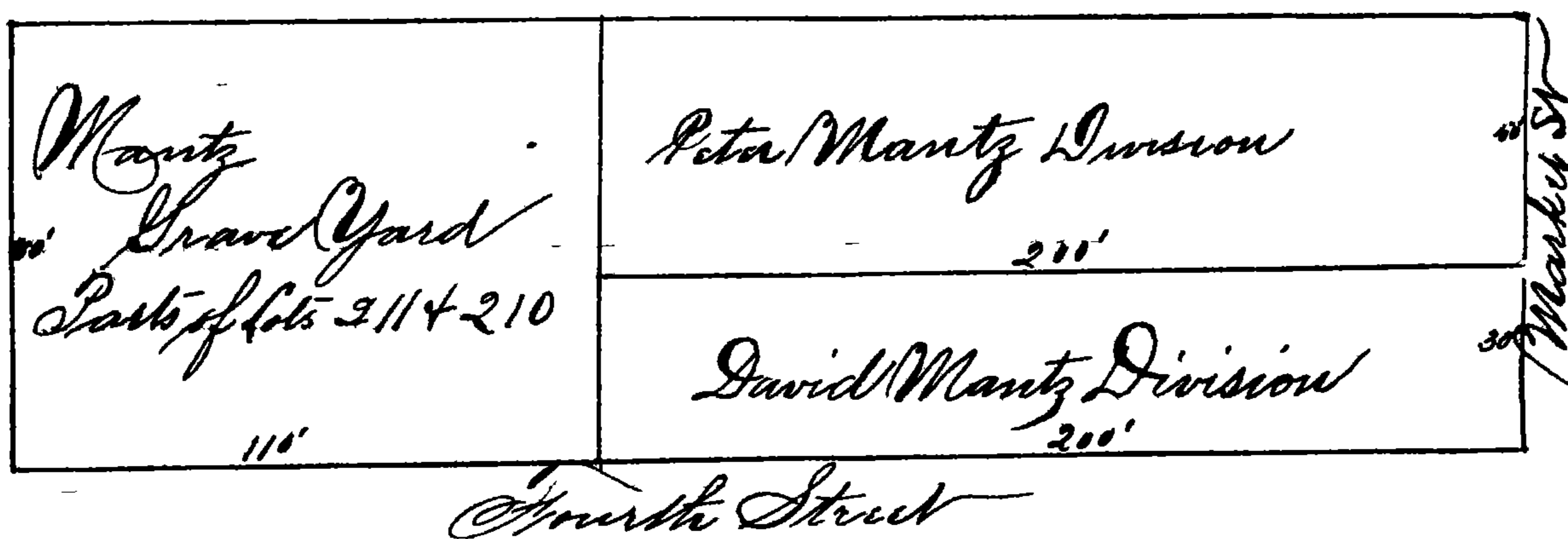

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for a Sale of certain
Real Estate situated on West Fourth Street in Frederick Maryland,

and described in the proceedings in this Case.

The Bill states that Casper Mantz, died about the year 1791, seized
and possessed of said Real Estate and by his last Will devised
the same, together with other Real Estate, to his five sons Francis,
Peter, Isaac, David, and John Mantz; that said five sons
by deed of partition divided all of the Real Estate so devised to them,
with the exception of said lot, which had been set apart and was known
for many years afterwards as a Grave yard; that said lot has
not since been disposed of, and is still owned by the heirs and
descendants of said Francis, Peter, David Isaac and John Mantz,
as tenants in common; that said lot has not been used for many
years as a place of burial and the most of the bodies heretofore
buried there, that could be identified, have been removed to other
and more suitable places for burial; that it has been partly in cul-
tivation and partly planted in Fruit trees, and is no longer
used as a "burying ground," except that it still has buried in it
a few bodies of persons who were buried there a great many years
ago; that said lot is desirably located as a place for building
