We do hereby acknowledge for, and on behalf of the German Baptist Brethren of Frederick, a body corporate, of Frederick, have, this 7th day of September A.D. 1885, bought of Francis Brough, and Milton G. Urner, Trustees in No. 5079 Equity, the Grave Yard property, described in the proceedings in said 5079 Equity, commonly known as, as the "Mounts Grave Yard" fronting on Fourth Street in Frederick City, one hundred and ten feet, more or less, and extending north on Klinehandts Alley eighty feet, more or less, at and for the Sum of Six hundred Dollars, to be paid for, as follows, two hundred Dollars to be paid Cash, upon the realization of this purchase by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity, and the balance to be paid, on the first day of April A.D. 1885, with interest from date.

The said Grave Yard property is purchased upon the following express provisions, understanding, and agreements,

- 1st. That said Lot shall be used by said German Baptist Brethren of Frederick for the purpose of building a house of worship thereon and for such other purposes as are incident to and connected with their use thereof as a place for Religious worship -
- 2- That said German Baptist Brethren of Frederick shall take proper care of all human remains buried in said Grave Yard, that may be exposed by them in making excavations upon said Lot, and resinter the same upon said said lot in an appropriate manner, and in an appropriate place properly enclosed in suitable boxes. -
- 3- That said German Baptist Brethren of Frederick, shall exhum the remains of all other bodies buried in said Lot, whose places of burial are indicated by mounds, Grave-stones or in any other manner, and that may not be interfered with by said excavations, and enclose the same in suitable boxes, and deliver the same, at Mount Olivet Cemetery for burial there as soon as a lot shall be provided in said Cemetery for such burial, by any persons interested in the re-burial of said bodies, but said German Baptist Brethren of Frederick shall not be at the expense of burying said bodies to be removed to said Cemetery or in providing a lot therefor
