

No. 5102 Equity

Order of Publication against non-resident Defendants. The subject of the Bill filed in the above cause is to sell the Real Estate situate in Frederick County Maryland, of which Harriet Williard widow of Abraham Williard, died seized and possessed and to divide the proceeds amongst the parties entitled thereto. The Bill alleges -

1st That Harriet Williard died intestate in or about the month of February A. D. 1885 seized and possessed of certain Real Estate situate in the county and state aforesaid.

2nd That said Real Estate originally contained 203 1/2 acres of land, more or less and was conveyed to said Harriet Williard by William S. Hesperger, surviving Executor of said Abraham Williard, dec'd. by deed dated April 5th A. D. 1878 and recorded in Liber A. F. No. 2 Folio 472 one of the Land Records of Frederick County. A certified copy of said deed marked Exhibit No. 1. is filed with said Bill.

3rd That 101 acres, 2 rods and 20 square perches of Land, more or less, sold by said Harriet Williard in her life-time to said Edgeman A. Williard, is to be deducted from the said 203 1/2 acres. A certified copy of deed from said Harriet to said Edgeman A. marked Exhibit No. 2 is filed as part of said Bill.

4th That said Harriet Williard left surviving, her eight children and one grand-child, the child of a deceased daughter, who are named and also the daughter's husbands at the heading of this Bill, all are of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, excepting John H. Williard who resides in Columbus Colorado County, Texas and Mary E. and her husband J. E. Boyer who reside in Dallas Texas.

5th That Edgar Stanley Delander is an infant and the child of a deceased daughter of the said Harriet Williard.

6th The Plaintiffs pray the Court to pass a decree to sell the lands and to divide the proceeds amongst the parties entitled thereto. That the same is not susceptible of division without loss or injury to the parties entitled and it being for the interest and advantage of all concerned that the same should be sold & for such other and further relief as the Equity of their case may require.

Also for a writ of Subpoena against the infant defendant and an order of Publication against the non-resident defendants.

It is thereupon ordered by the Court this 26th day of June A. D. 1885 that the plaintiffs give notice by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some Newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland once in each of four successive weeks before the 31st day of August A. D. 1885 to the said John H. Williard, Mary E. Boyer and her husband J. E. Boyer of the object and substance of this Bill and warn them to appear in person or by solicitor on or before the 10th day of December A. D. 1885 to answer the premises and show cause if any they have why a decree should not pass as prayed.
