Petition of Trustee to be allowed to modify terms of Sale and Creditors of the estate.

to your Trustee, the sum of \$577⁷⁰/₁₀₀, being the sum of 1578⁷⁰/₁₀₀ for the said one-third of the purchase money and 87⁷⁰/₁₀₀ interest on the same from the day of sale till paid.

2. That the said purchaser has expressed a desire to your Trustee, to be allowed to pay the Remaining two-thirds of said purchase money on the first day of April, 1886, instead of one-third on the said day of April, 1886 and 1887 respectively, as provided by the decree in this cause and asks to have a modification of the Terms of Sale, so as to effect this object

3. That your Trustee believes that it will be to the advantage of the estate to have said Terms so modified, as the expense of stating one Credit will thereby be saved.

4. And your Trustee prays your Honorable Court to be allowed to take the note of the said purchaser for the remaining two-thirds of the purchase money payable on the first day of April, 1886 and bearing interest from the day of Sale.
