I sold to Abraham Dous, at \$3⁵⁰ per acre, the tract mentioned in Exhibit No. 2, containing 10 acres and 22 perches of land. I sold to Robert Prior, at 10⁰⁰ per acre, a Tract mentioned in Exhibit No. 3, containing 8⁹⁰ perches of land.

To 11th Int. - 11th Ans. - They were put in possession.

To 12th Int. - 12th Ans. They have paid the payment, that is, due paying 5 down at the time.

To the 13th Int. - 13th Ans. I understand they are perfectly satisfactory there was no complaint made there.

To the 14th Int. - 14th Ans. Yes Sir - she is dead, I never heard of her leaving a Will at all, she left a Husband named Lewis, and two children, named John & Walter, as above stated, she died in July 1885

To the 15th Int. - 15th Ans. The said sales were fairly made, with the consent of the parties interested, they were made at Public Sale

To the 16th Int. - 16th Ans. Yes Sir.

To the 17th Int. - 17th Ans. They have not the difficulty in the way seems to be about those two minor children.

To 2nd Int. - 2nd Ans. I am acquainted with the parties to this said suit, and have known them for several years.

To the 3rd Int. - 3rd Ans. - I was, he is dead, he died in September, 1884, in Frederick County, Maryland, he died intestate.
