The Warehouse is a good Business Point for a man, but is not suitable for a Lady to handle. The Farm is liable to Wasting - If it is not very well taken care of, and I don't think the widow can't properly manage, and superintend it -

To the 10th Inter - 10th Ans. I think, by laying off a small parcel with the Ware-house, and offering it, and the farm, separately, it will bring the most money.

To the 11th Inter. 11th Ans. He died without a Will, and Mrs. Lantz and Robert Biggs are the Administrators.

To the Gen. Inter. by the Examiner. Ans. I know of nothing further signed Senior W. Harbough.
