To the 10th Inter. - 10th Ans. - I certainly do -

To the 11th Inter. - 11 Ans. - From the fact that I think that the interest on  
the Mortgage on the property would soon accumulate sufficiently to  
eat up the entire property. These infants have no means that I know of  
of keeping down the interest on said Mortgage, and besides the property will  
depreciate in value by the time the infants will become of age. The property  
being in the hands of Tenants, and it would be more to the advantage  
of the infants to sell the property and invest the proceeds for their benefit.  
If this is not done, in my opinion they will never get anything.

To the 13th Inter. - 13th Ans: - I look at exhibit No. 2. That is a certified  
copy of the Mortgage of which speak.

To the 14th Inter. - 14th Ans. - No sir

To the Gen. Interrogatory by the Examiner - Ans. I have given you  
all that I know about it.

Alfred Schley -

Samuel B. Ecker, a witness of Lawful age produced on the  
part of the Plaintiff - being duly sworn, and examined, to interrogatories  
herewith returned, deposes, and says

To the 1st Inter. - 1st Ans: - My name Samuel B. Ecker, my age 43  
years and my residence near Libertytown, Frederick County.

To the 2nd Inter. - 2d Ans: - I know them, and have known them for years.

To the 3rd Inter. - 3 Ans. - She first married W. Scott Rippeon. She has  
been married twice.

To the 4th Inter. - 4 Ans. Between Four and five years ago.

To the 5th Inter. - 5 Ans. She has three living, and some who are dead.  
Those living are living Rippeon who is the oldest, and whose age is  
about eleven or twelve years; the second is a girl, Estelle Rippeon who  
is about nine or ten, or along there; and the third is a boy, named  
William, aged, about six or seven years. These parties, all reside in Frederick  
County. (6 & 7 named as to this witness)

To the 6th Inter. - 6 Ans. He did have a property when he died which which  
he bought of J. Dinsley Jones. I look at Exhibit No. 1, now shown me, and  
that describes said property.

To the 7th Inter. - 7 Ans. - The Property is worth \$200. - I suppose

To the 8th Inter. - 8 Ans. - Yes sir, I do.

To the 9th Inter. - 9 Ans. - The reason why I think so is because it  
will depreciate, and I don't see how the infants themselves, or their  
mother can keep it up - It would be better for the infants to have  
the same sold to pay off the Mortgage, and the balance invested for their benefit.
