To the Honorable the Judges of said Court: Your orator, who prays as well for himself as for all other creditors of Mary Lefore, late of Frederick County, deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, complaining, says:

Bill of Complaint

1. That the said Mary Lefore was, in her lifetime, indebted unto your orator in the just and full sum of Seven dollars and twenty-two cents for sundry matters and things, properly chargeable in accounts as will fully appear by reference to a duly sworn and attested copy of said account herewith filed, as part hereof marked Exhibit A; and also in the sum of fifty-two dollars and sixty-five cents upon a magistrate's judgment dated the fourth day of March in the year Eighteen hundred and eighty-two with interest thereon from the date thereof till paid; and also in the sum of fifty-one dollars and fifty-eight cents upon another Magistrate's judgment dated the fourth day of December in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two with interest thereon from the date thereof till paid - Copies of both of which said judgments under the hands and seals of the justices by whom the same were rendered your orator filed with the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County as prescribed by law for making said judgments liens upon the real estate of the said Mary Lefore as will fully appear by reference to certified Copies of said judgments filed herewith as parts hereof marked Exhibit B and Exhibit C.

2. That the said Mary Lefore, being so indebted, as aforesaid unto your orator and also unto divers other persons, and having real and personal estate of some value, departed this life on, or about the fourth day of December in the year Eighteen hundred and eighty-five, intestate, seized of the Real Estate described in a certified copy of a Deed herewith filed, as part hereof marked Exhibit D.

3. That said Real Estate was conveyed to the said Mary Lefore and one Margaret Holliday her sister, who died some years ago, intestate seized of a half interest in said Real Estate, and leaving the said Mary Lefore as her sole heir, as your Orator is advised and believes, whereby the whole interest in and to said Real Estate vested in the said Mary Lefore. 4. That it is unknown, whether the said Mary Lefore left any heirs surviving her.

5. That Administration of all and singular the personal estate of the said Mary Lefore has been lately granted by the Orphan's Court of said County to one J. Hiram Taylor, of said County, who in virtue thereof has possessed himself of the said personal estate of the said Mary Lefore, as will fully appear by reference to a certificate of letters of administration granted on the estate of said Mary Lefore herewith filed as part hereof marked Exhibit E.

6. That your orator is informed and believes that said personal estate is not sufficient to discharge all the just debts due and
