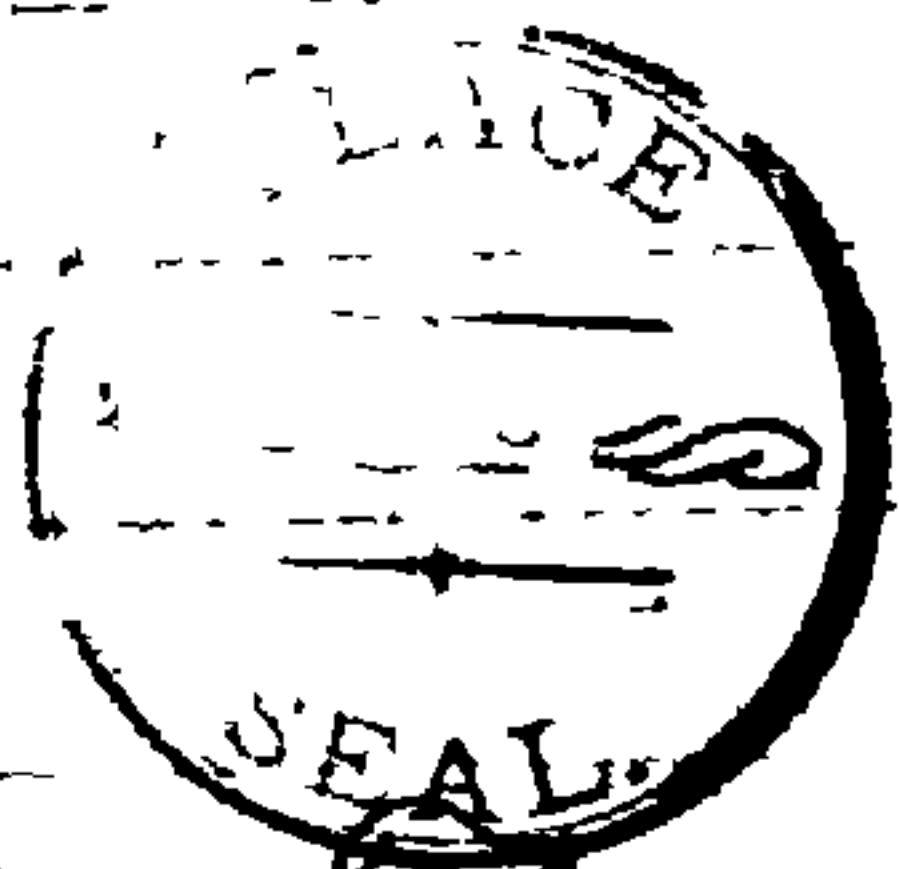

At the request of Mary Lefevre & Margaret Holliday, the
following Deed was rendered March 9th 1863 stamped & cancelled -
This Indenture made this twenty fourth day of November in
the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty two
between Lewis M. Motter and Alice his wife of the one part, and
Mary Lefevre and Margaret Holliday of the other part, all of Frederick
County in the State of Maryland, Witnesses, that for and in
consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars present
money to them in hand paid by the said Mary Lefevre and
Margaret Holliday, before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof they the said Lewis M. Motter and Alice his
wife do hereby acknowledge, and from every part and parcel thereof do
hereby acquit, exonerate, and discharge the said Mary Lefevre and
Margaret Holliday their heirs, executors, and administrators, they the
said Lewis M. Motter and Alice do hereby grant, bargain, and sell
and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said
Mary Lefevre and Margaret Holliday their heirs and assigns all that
part of a tract or parcel of land called "Carolina" lying and being
in Frederick County and State of Maryland contained in the following
courses and distances, and beginning for said part at a Stone heap
being the end of the eighth line of that part of Carolina conveyed
to a certain Lewis Motter by William M. Thurson and running
with the ninth line South one and a half degrees East fifteen
and a half perches, South eighty five degrees West nine and a half
perches North one and a half degrees West twenty and two tenths
perches to intersect the said eighth line aforesaid thence with it to
