17 Int. What was next offered.

Ans. Lot No. 3.

18 Int. Was Lot No. 3, offered all in one tract, or otherwise?

Ans. All in one tract.

19 Int. What became of that?

Ans. Knocked down at the bid of John G. Rogers.

20 Int. After Lot No. 3, was sold, what was next offered?

Ans. The Lot No. 4.

21 Int. What became of that?

Ans. It was quickly withdrawn.

22 Int. At what bid.

Ans. I can not distinctly state.

23 Int. After Lot No. 4, was withdrawn, what was next offered?

Ans. Lots No. 5 & 6 jointly.

24 Int. What became of them? Ans. - Withdrawn.

25 Int. After they were withdrawn, what was offered next?

Ans. Lots No. 1, 5 & 6 jointly.

26 Int. What became of them?

Ans. They were knocked at the bid of Jno. G. Rogers.
