1. That there are several Judgments, against Joseph L. Routzahn, on which Writs of fieri facias were issued, and levies made by the Sheriff on the personal property of said Routzahn prior to the execution of the deed of Trust to your Trustees exhibited in this cause.

2. That among said Judgments is one in favor of Johnson Harvester Co., a body corporate for the sum of \$1045.48 with interest from date thereof and costs, a certified copy whereof is herewith filed marked Exhibit J.
