To the Honorable the Judges of said Court: - Your Orator, John Murdock, who sues as well for himself as for all the other creditors of John Hagan late of Frederick County, deceased, who will come in, and contribute to the expenses of this suit, complaining says: -

Bill of Complaint

1. That the said John Hagan was in his lifetime indebted unto your orator in the full and just sum of One Hundred and Seventy Seven Dollars (\$177.00) upon his certain sealed note dated September 9. 1876, payable to your Orator, or order, six months after date, with interest from date, which is due, and wholly unpaid both as to principal and interest (2) and also in the sum of One Hundred and Thirty Seven Dollars (\$137.00) upon his certain sealed Note dated September 9. 1876 payable to your Orator, or order three months after date, with interest from date, which is due, and wholly unpaid both as to principal, and interest except the sum of Twenty Two Dollars (\$22.00) which will fully appear by your Orator Exhibits A & B respectively, herewith filed, and which with all the other Exhibits are prayed to be taken and considered as part of this Bill of Complaint as fully as if herein at large, in words, and figures set forth.

2. That the said John Hagan was in his lifetime also indebted unto a certain Frank J. Hagan (One of the parties to this suit) upon a certain Promissory Note in the full sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) dated July 12, 1882 payable six months after date, with interest from date, which said note was transferred and assigned for value to your Orator by the said Frank J. Hagan and on which there is now due your orator the principal, and interest in full except a credit of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) - as appears thereon, and your Orator herewith files the said note as "Exhibit C".

3. That the said John Hagan was also indebted unto the said Frank J. Hagan in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) on his certain promissory note dated November 13. 1882, payable to the said Frank Hagan under six months after date which said note the said Frank Hagan endorsed for value to your Orator, and which is due, and wholly unpaid both as to Principal and Interest, except a credit of Nine Dollars (\$9.00) as appears on the back thereof, and your Orator files herewith said note marked "Exhibit D".
