In pursuance of the aimped order of the Court, and notice given me by the Solicitor for Plaintiffs in the above entitled cause, I, Clayton O. Keefe, one of the Regular Examiners of said Court, duly appointed, qualified, and sworn, having met at my Office and fixed the 25th day of July A. D. 1887 at my Office in Frederick City as the time and place for taking the Testimony in this cause, and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned, did, at the appointed time and place proceed to take the following evidence to-wit:-

The Plaintiffs filed with the Examiner as evidence Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 which are herewith returned.

Isaiah Nusbamm a Witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiffs being duly sworn and Examined to Interrogatories deposes and says as follows:-

1st Int. State your name, age, and residence?

Ans. Isaiah Nusbamm, age 54 years, Linganore District, Frederick County.

2d Int. Did you know Daniel Nusbamm, late of Frederick County; If yes, is he living or dead; if dead, when and where did he die, and did he die Testate or Intestate?

Ans. I knew him, he is dead, he died in Frederick County in the Month of March 1886; he left no Will.

3d Int. Did said Daniel Nusbamm die seized, and possessed of any real estate, or of any interest in any Real Estate? and if yes, describe the same, give its quantity, and Value?

Ans. He died. He had and interest (an undivided one half interest) in about 575 Acres of land lying in Frederick County. The whole of it is worth about \$8000. more or less.

4th Int. Look at papers now shown you marked Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6, and state whether or not the real estate described in said Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, & 4 is that of which the said Daniel Nusbamm died seized, and possessed of a half interest in, with the exception of that conveyed away by Exhibits Nos. 5 & 6?

Ans. I look at Exhibits - Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6. The lands described in Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3 & 4 less that conveyed away by Exhibits Nos. 5 & 6 are the lands of which he died seized, and possessed of, a half interest therein.

5th Int. Who owned the other half interest in said lands?

Ans. Philip Nusbamm, a brother of Daniel's.

6th Int. Is said Philip Nusbamm now living or dead, and if dead, when and where did he die, and did he die Testate or Intestate?

Ans. He is dead, he died in Woodville District in Frederick County on or about the 24th day of May 1887 - He left no will.

7th Int. Did either said Daniel or Philip Nusbamm leave any widow or lineal Descendants?

Ans. Neither of them left any widow or lineal descendants, neither of them had ever been married.
