land (1) South  $12^{\circ}$  West  $28\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a stone formerly planted at the beginning of said deed from George Lorentz and wife to Charles Hendry, it being the end of the first line of said McHenry's land, and with said line reversed connecting same, (2) North  $75\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $122\frac{1}{2}$  perches to the place of beginning, containing One Hundred and Thirt-four (134) Acres of land Division No 2. Being part of a tract of land called "Slip in Easy" or "The Recurvey on Slip in Easy" part of a tract called "Many Makes One, or be it part of any other tract, whatever - Beginning for the same at the stump of a White Oak Tree, the Original beginning of a tract called "Joseph's Advance" and of the aforesaid tract called "Slip in Easy", it being also the beginning of Division No. 1, above, as laid off by these Commissioners in the division of the real Estate mentioned in these proceedings, and running thence with the outlines of said Division No 1, the Eight following Courses & Distances, viz. (1) South  $77\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  West  $22\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a White Oak Tree marked with 12 Notches - (2) South  $73\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West 16 perches to a White Oak Tree marked with 12 Notches, (3) South  $29\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $33\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a stone now planted, (4) South  $28\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  East  $15\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a stone now planted (5) South  $48^{\circ}$  East  $44\frac{3}{4}$  perches to a stone now planted, (6) South  $34^{\circ}$  East 30 perches to a Stone now planted, (7) South  $47\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  East 49 perches to a stone now planted, (8) South  $62\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  East  $45\frac{3}{4}$  perches to the middle of the Public Road leading from Urbana to Jemansville (it being South  $62\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  East  $1\frac{3}{4}$  perches from a stone now planted near the west side of said road), then up in the middle of the road, (9) South  $59^{\circ}$  West  $1\frac{1}{2}$  perches, then (10) North  $62\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  West  $1\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a Stone now planted near the West side of said road, still (11) North  $62\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  West  $44\frac{3}{4}$  perches to a stone now planted, (12) North  $47\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  West 49 perches to a stone now planted, (13) North  $34^{\circ}$  West 30 perches to a large or large Poplar Tree marked with 12 notches, (14) North  $48^{\circ}$  West  $44\frac{3}{4}$  perches to a stone now planted - (15) North  $36\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $13\frac{3}{4}$  perches to a stone now planted (it being at the end of 4 perches on a line drawn South  $29\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West from the end of the 3<sup>d</sup> line of this Division, then (16) North  $41^{\circ}$  West 18 perches to a stone now planted, (17) North  $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $29\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a stone now planted, (18) North  $75\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $34\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a Stone now planted, (19) North  $75\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $34\frac{3}{4}$  perches to a stone now planted (20) North  $89^{\circ}$  West  $51\frac{3}{4}$  perches to a large poplar tree marked with 12 notches, near the branch (21) South  $81\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  $16\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a small poplar tree marked with 12 notches on the North Bank, of the branch, (22) South  $7^{\circ}$  West 67 perches to large White Oak Tree marked with 12 notches, then (23) South  $50\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  West  $4\frac{1}{2}$  perches to a large marked White Oak Tree at the end of the 5<sup>th</sup> line of a tract of land called "Frankton", it being the end of the 5<sup>th</sup> line of Mrs Ann S.
