At the request of Henry Killhide the following Deed is recorded the 5th day of June 1853

This Indenture, made this 5th day of June in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and thirty-three, between Catharine Flammagan of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and Henry Killhide of the County and State aforesaid, of the other. Whereas L P M Daleh, Esquire was appointed by a decree of Frederick County Court sitting as a Court of Equity case No. 621, Equity made and passed on the 22nd day of January 1829, Trustee to sell for the purposes and on the terms & conditions therein particularly specified, the following tracts or parcels of land lying in Frederick County aforesaid being part of a tract of land called "Loft Gained" which was conveyed on or about the 15th of April 1810, by George Koontz to Jacob Staley of --- by deed of bargain and sale for 109 Acres, more or less, except 2 1/2 acres more or less purchased by, but not yet conveyed to Michael Snuggle and also all that parcel of land situate in the County aforesaid being part of a tract of land called "Sure hand Sure find"; which was on or about the 30 August 1822, conveyed by Philip Morningstar to Jacob Staley aforesaid for 9 1/2 Acres more or less, which two parcels of land was mortgaged by Jacob Staley aforesaid to Jacob Wächter & Christian Widdrich by
