The above Petition having been read and considered it is thereupon on this 2nd day of May 1888 Ordered and decreed by the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a court of Equity that the Auditor of this Court in stating an account of the Trust Money in the above Cause allow the claim of the Petitioner above mentioned, subject to the further order of this Court - John A Lynch Judge of the Cir. Court
