of a division without great loss and injury, and that it would be to the benefit and advantage of all parties interested therein, especially the infants, to have the same sold, and the proceeds divided among those severally entitled.

The Bill as amended thus prays the following relief:

1. That a decree be passed by the Court for the sale of said estate and a division of the proceeds thereof among the heirs at law & That the writ of subpoena be issued against the resident defendants, and an order of publication against the Non-Resident Defendants, Harry Magruder and Henry Hill - 3. For General Relief - It is thereupon, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the Plaintiffs by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some Newspaper published in Frederick County, once a week for four successive weeks before the 6th day of March A.D. 1886 give Notice to said non-resident defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, and warn them, that is Harry Magruder and Henry Hill, to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor on or before the 18th day of June A.D. 1886 to answer the premises and show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed -
