At the request of Eleanor Hobbs the following Deed was Recorded December 29th 1863

This Deed made this 31st day of June in the Year One Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-three by Aloysius S Althoff, and William A. Althoff (Executors of Henry Althoff, deceased), of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland; Witnesseth that for the consideration of Two Thousand dollars the said Aloysius S Althoff, and William A. Althoff (Executors of Henry Althoff, deceased), do grant unto Eleanor Hobbs, (wife of John Hobbs) and John T. Hobbs, of the State and County aforesaid, all the following parts of Tracts or parcels of land, part of a Tract called "Horns Choke" beginning at a stone planted, on the division line of this farm and the farm now owned by Elias Lilly, and running thence 15 1/2 East 7 1/2 perches to a stone South 82 1/2 E 27 perches North 10 East 72.3 perches North 89 E. 40 perches South 10 N 78.1 perches South 79 1/2 E. 16.1 perches South 4 West 21.3 perches. North 76 West 139 perches North 30 East 25.4 perches South 64 E. 21.4 perches South 68 1/2 East 52 perches North 66 E East 18.9 perches North 34 E 80 perches.
