At The Request, of Jane Martin the following Deed is Recorded - The 22nd Day of July 1839.

This Indenture (in two parts) made and concluded the Neay day 11th in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, by and between Eddy Orme, of Frederick County, and State of Maryland, of the one part, and Jane Martin, of the same County, and State, of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas they, the said Eddy Orme, and Jane Martin are seized in fee simple, and have, and hold, as Tenants in Common, certain interests or shares in the following described piece or part of a Tract of Land, to-wit the said Eddy Orme four and the said Jane Martin four ninths parts thereof - it being a part of that Original Tract of Land, called the "Resurvey on Right and Good Reason"; Beginning for the same, at a Stake and a heap of Stones Standing at the end of 80 perches, on the 23rd line of the whole Tract, called the "Resurvey on Right & Good Reason," and running thence agreeably to the Original, calls, as fixed and determined by Justice J. O'neill Sen. Fred County the 18th of February 1833, as per his Certificate - South thirty three degrees West Eighty one perches to a pile of Stones at the end of the said 23rd line then South Sixty Eight Degrees West Eight perches to a Stake, North Seventy Six degrees West fifty nine and a half perches to a Stone formerly planted North forty degrees West Twenty perches to a Stake. North Twenty Six degrees East Twenty perches to a pile of Stones. North forty one degrees West thirteen and one fourth perches to a pile of Stones, South Seventy Nine degrees, West Twenty Six perches to a marked Tree at the end of the sixth line of Peter Kamps part of said Original, then with said line reserved South thirty nine degrees East twenty eight and a half perches to a stone planted South Eighty degrees West One hundred and ten perches to a stone planted South Eighteen degrees West twelve perches to a stake South Eighty degrees West ten perches ending on the side of a hill, and
