In the name of God Amen, I Henry Pampel of Frederick County in the State of Maryland being in perfect health of body and of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle all my worldly affairs, and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and following that is to say - I give and devise unto Ann Pampel, my Wife, during her natural life, or widowhood All of the income derived from my entire, real and personal, whereof I shall die seized and possessed, or may in any manner be entitled to, and in the event of her death, or remarriage, I then devise and bequeath as follows. Item. I give and devise unto my daughter Sarah A A Pampel the sum of five hundred dollars - Item. I give and devise unto my daughter Mary C C Simpson (Wife of John A Simpson the sum of two hundred dollars, and the entire residue of my estate, I will and bequeath as follows - I give and devise two thirds of aforesaid residue, unto my daughters, Sarah A. A. Pampel and Mary C C Simpson, Wife of John A Simpson to be equally divided between them Share and Share alike, for their own and behoof forever, and the remaining one third of aforesaid residue of said estate, I give and devise unto Capt James M. Shury in Trust for my son Philip F. Pampel (after first charging him with all monies I have paid for him, or may be liable to pay for him in the future), and the income derived from his portion of the estate I wish used for the support of himself and family during his natural life, and after his death his entire portion Principals and interest, to descend to his children, share and share alike, for their own use and behoof
