The Bill of Complaint of "Mechanicstown Building Association of Frederick County" a body corporate, Frederick White, John H. Ronger Executors of the last will of Henry Ronger deceased and Frederick White Administrators of the goods of George F. Eyles deceased, who sue as well for themselves as all other creditors of George F. Eyles late of Frederick County deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, respectfully shews.

1. That a certain George F. Eyles late of Frederick County deceased, was in his lifetime indebted unto your Complainant "Mechanicstown Building Association of Frederick County" a body corporate, in the sum of four hundred dollars secured by Mortgage upon certain real estate a certified copy of which Mortgage is herewith filed as part hereof marked Exhibit No. 1. and which is the first lien upon said real estate and on which sundry payments have been made tending in the neighborhood of one hundred and fifty dollars still due and unpaid and interest.
2. That said George F. Eyles was in his lifetime indebted to your Complainant in the sum of \$99⁰⁰ with interest from August 24th A. D. 1886 and \$1⁰⁰ costs on a judgment a certified copy whereof is herewith filed marked Exhibit No. 2 all of which is due and unpaid.
3. That said George F. Eyles was in his life indebted unto your Complainant John H. Ronger Executor of the last will of Henry Ronger late of Frederick County deceased, in the sum of Eighty dollars being balance due on purchase money of about one hundred acres of Mountain land adjoining the lands of John Ronger, John H. Ronger and others in Frederick County, which said George F. Eyles bought of said Henry Ronger in the lifetime of both of said parties but for which said George F. Eyles got no deed, not having paid all the purchase money, and your Complainant files herewith an exemplification of letters testamentary on the Estate of said Henry Ronger marked Exhibit No. 3.
4. That said George F. Eyles being indebted as aforesaid to your Complainants and also unto divers other persons in considerable sums of money and having real estate situated in Frederick County and some personal Estate departed this life in or about the month of October A. D. 1888, intestate leaving as his only heirs at law two children, a son Frederick W. Eyles and a daughter Emma K. Eyles both of whom are infants under the age of twenty one years of age, unmarried and residents of Frederick County.
5. That the real estate of which said George F. Eyles died seized and possessed
