Summers for one hundred and seventy acres one rod and twenty nine perches dated the twenty eight of March Eighteen hundred and fifty one and running thence by and with the second line of the one acre deed aforesaid two courses and with the middle of the said public road connecting the same course with the original location, North thirty seven degrees East fourteen and a half perches then leaving said public road still with said one acre deed North fifty degrees West thirteen and a half perches to the north side of a lane leading to the late John Smith's house, it being at the end of the sixth line of a tract of land called 'The Young Beginner' it also being the end of the sixteenth line of the part of 'Delight' and the part of the 'Recurry on Hunters Delight' conveyed by Henry Cowles to Benjamin Rontzahn for one hundred and forty four and three quarters acres dated the thirty first of March Eighteen hundred and twenty three and running thence by and with the said deed and the aforesaid tract called 'The Young Beginner' reversed connecting the same course with the original location through North sixty and a quarter degrees West thirty eight perches, South thirty seven degrees West twenty eight perches, North eighty one degrees West eighty one perches to a stone on the second line of the whole tract called 'The Recurry on Hunters Delight' then by and with said second line and with the one hundred and forty four and three quarters acres parcel aforesaid connecting the same South three and a half degrees East thirty two and three quarters perches then South forty seven degrees East fifteen perches, South Eighteen degrees West twelve and fifteen hundredths perches North sixty seven degrees West twelve perches to the end of six and a quarter perches on the third line of the whole tract called 'The Recurry on Hunters Delight' and running thence by and with the outlines of said whole tract and the one hundred and forty four and three quarters acres aforesaid, South forty eight degrees West thirty one and three quarters perches to a stone South four degrees East forty perches to a stone, South sixty nine degrees East fourteen perches to a stone, South thirty five degrees East fifty four perches to a stone, South eighty six degrees East three and a half perches to a stone at the beginning of the aforesaid tract of land called 'Little Pottle' for seven and three quarters acres conveyed by Henry Cowles to Benjamin Rontzahn the thirty first of March Eighteen hundred and twenty three, then South thirty four and a quarter degrees East nine and seven tenths perches to a stone, South eighty three degrees East eleven and four tenths perches to the end of the first line of six and three quarters acres deeded by George W.
