To the Honorable the Judges of said Court.  
The Report of sale of Jeremiah M. Eyles and Andrew H. Eyles, Trustees appointed by the decree of your Honorable Court passed in the above case to sell the real estate decreed to be sold, respectfully shows, that after giving bond with approved security, as required by said decree, and after giving more than three weeks previous notice of the time, place, manner and terms of sale, by advertisement in the "Banner of Liberty," a newspaper published in Frederick County and by hand bills extensively circulated, they did in pursuance with said notice attend at Haugh & Garbers store in Johnsville, Frederick County, conveniently near to the property to be sold, on Saturday the 16<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1859 at 12 1/2 o'clock P.M. when they proceeded to sell said real estate as follows—

1. In the first place they offered at public sale to the highest bidder the farm containing 115 acres 3 rods & 15 perches of land, more or less, described in Exhibit No. 4 filed in the above case, and only receiving a bid of \$ 28. per acre for said farm, which your Trustees deemed inadequate & which the other parties in interest were not willing said farm should be sold for, they did not sell the same.

2. In the second place your Trustees offered at public sale to the highest bidder the Stone Farm containing 91 acres 1 Rod & 3 1/4 perches of land, more or less, being the land described in Exhibit No. 1. filed in the above case, excepting that part conveyed therefrom and described in Exhibits No. 5 & 6. and sold the same to N. Addison Englar, he being the highest and best bidder therefor at and for the sum of forty two dollars and twenty five cents per acre and the said N. A. Englar has obligated himself to comply with the terms of sale, as will appear by his acknowledgment of purchase filed herewith marked Exhibit "N. A. E."

3. In the next place your Trustees offered at public sale, the Wood Lot containing 11 acres 1 rod and 9 perches more or less, described in Exhibit No. 2. in the above case and sold the same to Upton H. Richmond, he being the highest and best bidder therefor at and for the sum of ten dollars & seventy five cents per acre, and the said Upton H. Richmond has obligated himself to comply with the terms of sale as will appear by his acknowledgment of purchase filed herewith marked Exhibit "U. H. R."

4. In the next place your Trustees offered the Wood Lot containing 4 acres 3 rods & 21 ps. more or less, described in Exhibit No. 3. Excepting that conveyed therefrom described in Exhibit No. 7.
