2^d Ans. I knew Frederick Correll and Catharine Correll his wife both late of Frederick County. They are now both dead.
To the 3^d Inter.

3^d Ans. They both died near Ridgeville in Frederick County on the last day of November A.D. 1882 Frederick died first and his wife last. He died about a quarter before six o'clock P.M. and she died at three and a half o'clock P.M. on the same day. I was present when they both died.
To the 4th Inter.

4th Ans. Frederick Correll left no children, nor brothers, nor sisters, nor parent surviving him.
To the 5th Inter.

5th Ans. He left descendants of deceased brothers. I know the following children of his deceased brother Joel viz -

William H. Correll married to General his wife the defendants in this suit, both of whom are adults and residents of Baltimore City Maryland.

John J. Correll married to Anna his wife both of whom are adults and residents of Queen Anne's County Md.

Joel E. Correll and Emma his wife both of whom are adults and residents of Baltimore City Md. E. married to John L. Buzzell both of whom are adults and residents of Montgomery County.

Mary Frances, who married Thomas Stevin.

Anson M., who married James W. Dighton one

Kate C., who married William Phelps, all of whom are adults and residents of Baltimore City, Maryland. I know all of these just mentioned but am not acquainted with the children of all his other deceased brothers.
To the 6th Inter.

6th Ans. The said Frederick Correll and Catharine Correll died seized and possessed of real estate.
To the 7th Inter.

7th Ans. I look at "Exhibit No. 1" the real estate therein described is the same of which Frederick and Catharine Correll died seized and possessed.
To the 8th Inter.

8th Ans. The said property can not be divided among the parties interested therein without great loss and injury thereto.
To the 9th Inter.

9th Ans. I am acquainted with the defendant William H. Correll. He is my nephew. He is not of sound mind and is not capable of the management of his person or estate.

John M. Baker a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined by Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant and hereto returns deposes and says,
To the 1st Inter.

1st Ans. I know all of John's, Jonathan's and Joel Correll's children as mentioned in the Bill and have known them for some years.
To the 2^d Inter.

2^d Ans. I knew them well. They are dead.
To the 3^d Inter.

3^d Ans. They died near Ridgeville in Frederick County in November 1882. Frederick Correll died first by a few hours.
