The Bill of Complaint of Annie M. Adams and
Edward J. Adams of Frederick County, Maryland,
respectfully represents unto your Honor.

1st That on the 12th day of November 1888, one John F. Adams of Frederick County, Maryland, departed this life, intestate, seized and possessor of certain real estate lying and being in Frederick County aforesaid, which is correctly described in a deed conveying the same to him from Thomas Clowd, a certified copy of which deed as recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 1. to this bill, which Exhibit, with all other Exhibits by the Plaintiffs filed herewith, it is prayed may be considered a part hereof.

2^d That the said John F. Adams left surviving him a widow, one of the above named Plaintiffs and the following children and heirs at law, a son, a son named Edward J. Adams, who is one of the Plaintiffs, a son, Francis L. Adams; a son, Joseph H. Adams; a daughter Stella J. Adams; a son, John M. Adams; also Charles F. Adams; and a daughter Flora E. Adams, all of which children reside in Frederick County, Maryland, and all are infants under twenty one years of age with the exception of Edward J. Adams, who is an adult.

3^d That the real estate described in Exhibit No. 1. on the death of the said John F. Adams descended to and vested in the above named children and heirs at law as tenants in common, subject to the dower interest of the Plaintiff Annie M. Adams therein, who is willing to and asks that said real estate be sold free from her dower, she being willing to accept in lieu thereof such a sum of money as your Honorable Court may accord to her.

4th That the real estate described in Exhibit No. 1. can not be divided among said parties without great loss and injury and that it would be to the interest and advantage of all of said parties and especially the infant children and heirs at law of the said John F. Adams sold under the decree of your Honorable Court and the proceeds distributed among them according to their respective interests.

And the Plaintiff pray for the following relief—

1st That a subpoena may be issued by your Honorable Court directed to the said Francis L. Adams, Joseph H. Adams, Stella J. Adams, John M. Adams, Charles F. Adams and Flora E. Adams of Frederick County commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some certain day to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

2^d That a decree may be passed by your Honorable Court directing said
