This Mortgage, made this seventeenth day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and eighty seven, by Charles C. Shriver of Frederick County, State of Maryland. Wherein, whereas under and by virtue of the last will and testament of Lewis P. Shriver late of Frederick County deceased, the said Charles C. Shriver was constituted and appointed Executor of the said last will and testament, and whereas a certain Joseph Byers and Lewis P. Shriver became the securities or bondsmen of the said Charles C. Shriver for the faithful performance of said trust, repaid in him and whereas one of the provisions of said last will enjoined and directed the said Charles C. Shriver as Executor to place or pay into the First National Bank of Gettysburg, the sum of Eight hundred dollars out of the money of the estate coming into his hands, for the use of a certain Rome H. Shriver to be paid to him when he the said Rome H. Shriver shall arrive at the age of twenty one years, and whereas the said Charles C. Shriver as Executor has failed to pay over the said sum of money as directed and has settled his final account with the Orphan Court of Frederick County without complying with the directions of said will, whereby his said securities may suffer loss. Now, in consideration of the aboves promises and the sum of one dollar in hand paid to the said Charles C. Shriver the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and for the purpose of keeping the said Joseph Byers and Lewis P.
