Thirdly, - I give devise and bequest to the relatives of my present wife their heirs, and assigns, the sum or amounts following, that is to say: - To Catherine Deek the sum of two hundred dollars, To Terence Byrne the sum of three hundred dollars, To Joseph Byrne the sum of three hundred dollars, To Elizabeth Barry the sum of two hundred dollars.

Fourthly, - I give and bequest to my Executor the sum of one hundred dollars, in Trust, for the benefit of the poor of Frederick, and it is my desire and request that my executor shall pay the above and within named legacies to the several persons named, their heirs or assigns, as soon after my decease as it will be possible for him to do, and I desire her also to appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars of my estate to the construction of a monument or tomb stone, at the head of my grave and

Lastly, I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Mary Deek, to be sole Executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 25th day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.
