The sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) I desire to be paid Rev. Father Kane of the Archdiocese of Baltimore City, in part for Masses for the repose of my soul.

I give and bequeath to my beloved niece Mary Cecilia Mullins (nee Byrne) whom I have raised, and to whom I am devotedly attached all my real and personal property during her natural life, and in not any way subject to any control of her present husband, or any future husband she may have, and at her death, I devise and bequeath the property aforesaid to her children to be divided share and share alike among them, the children of any deceased child to take the share the parent would be entitled to if living. -

I hereby appoint my friend Doctor Frank W. Smith of Frederick City Executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and nullifying all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this, and none other to be my last will and testament. -
