and the proceeds of sale after payment of the expenses incident thereto, the costs of these proceedings &c. &c. divided among them according to their respective rights and your Orators allege that such a disposition of said property would be for the interest, benefit and advantage of all concerned and is the most practicable and satisfactory method to be adopted.

1. Your Orators therefore pray your Honors to pass a decree for the sale of said land of which said Thomas W. Harro died seized and possessed as aforesaid and without having sold, excepting and reserving however their family burial lot on said property containing half an acre of land more or less with a right of way for ingress and egress to and from said lot for burial purposes and other purposes incident to the proper care thereof by a trustee or trustees to be thereby appointed and to report to your Honorable Court.

2. And your Orators further pray your Honors to grant unto them the State of Maryland writ of subpoena to the said Corilla E. Hearer and David D. Hearer her husband herein named as defendants directed who reside at Boston, in Alleghany County in the State of Maryland commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court by a certain day therein named, to answer the premises and stand to, abide by and perform such order or decree as your Honorable Court may pass therein and as to the other defendants who are non residents of this State, your Orators pray your Honors to pass an order of publication as against Sarah W. Williams and A. D. Williams her husband who reside at Newsum in Adams County in the State of Nebraska and George W. Harro and Junie Harro his wife who reside at Mansfield, in Richland County, in the State of Ohio and William B. Harro and Alice Harro his wife who reside at Oklahoma City in Oklahoma Territory in these United States notifying them of the substance and object of this Bill and warning them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court by a day certain to be therein named, to answer the premises and show cause if any they have why a decree should not be passed as prayed.

3. And your Orators further pray your Honors to grant unto them such other, further and general relief as their case may require and to your Honors shall seem just and right.
