The above Petition and Exhibits and all other proceedings in this Cause having been by the Court read and considered. It is thereupon this 17th day of October in the year Eighteen Hundred and ninety two by the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court adjudged ordered that F. Marion Fauble and John E.
