

No. 5803. Equity.

That a decree may be passed for the sale of said real Estate,
 4. That the proceeds of said sale may be distributed among the parties
 entitled thereto according to their respective rights.
 5. That the plaintiff may have such other and a further relief as his
 case may require.
 6. That process may issue against the resident defendants.
 7. That an order of Publication may issue against the non-resident
 defendants William H. Heagy and Barbara A. V. Heagy, his wife,
 giving them notice of the object and substance of the bill and warning
 them to appear in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity,
 in person or by Solicitor on or before a certain day to be named therein
 to show cause if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
 It is thereupon this first day of July A.D. 1891, adjudged and ordered by
 the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity, that the plaintiff
