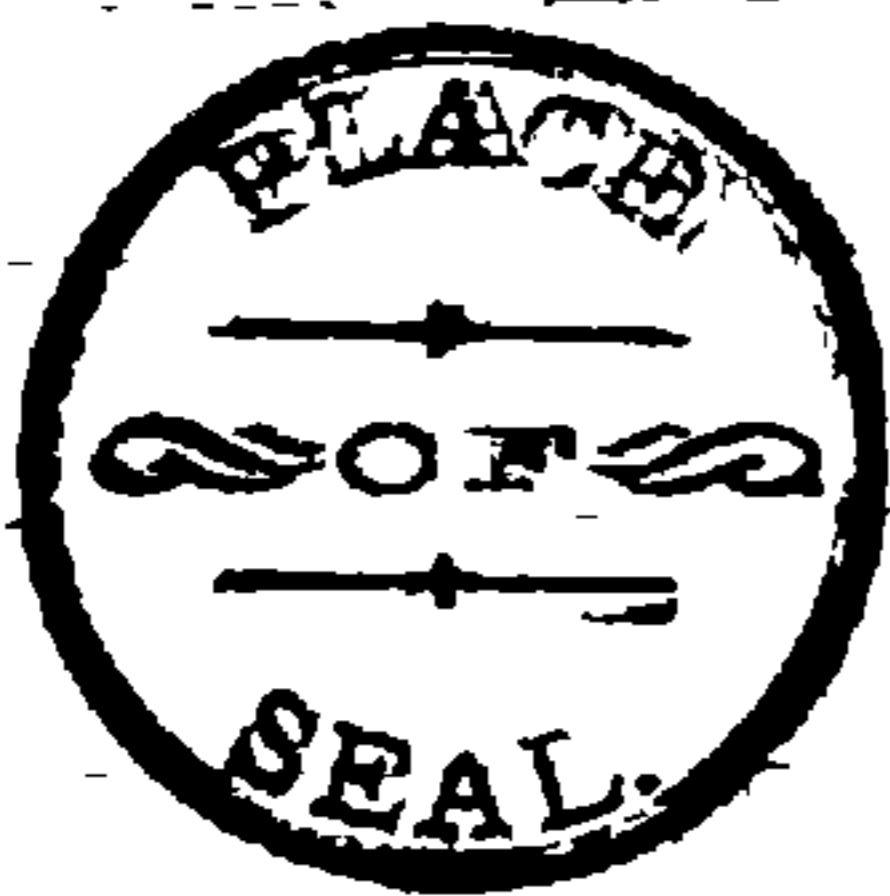

This Deed, made this twentieth day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy-one, by George Blessing and Susan Blessing his wife of Frederick County and State of Maryland, Witnesses, that in consideration of Five thousand three hundred and ten dollars the said George Blessing and Susan Blessing, his wife do grant unto Charles Cooper of the same County and State, all that lot or parcel of ground situated in Frederick County and State of Maryland, called "Franken dall," it being intended to convey by this deed the same lot or parcel of ground deeded by Michael Blessing to George Blessing under date the 27th day of August 1831 and recorded in Liber J. S. No 157 folios 433, 434 and 435, one of the Land Records of Frederick County and containing one hundred and eighteen acres of land more or less, independent of a School House lot. Metes and bounds deeded by George Blessing supposed to contain three quarters of an acre of land, and by reference being had to the aforesaid Deed the Courses and distances will more fully appear in fee simple.
