divided amongst said parties without great loss and damage and
that it would be to the interest and advantage of all the parties to have
all of said real Estate sold under a decree of your Honorable Court
and the proceeds of sale divided amongst those entitled according
to their respective interests. The Bill then prays for a sale of the
said real under a decree of this Court for a subpoena against the
resident defendants and an order of publication against the above
named non resident defendant

It is thereupon this 12th day of May A.D. 1893
adjudged and ordered that the Complainant by causing a
copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published
in Frederick County once a week for four successive weeks
before the 17th day of June A.D. 1893 give notice to the non resident
defendants of the object and substance of this Bill and warn
them to appear in this Court in person or by whitor on or before
the 5th day of July A.D. 1893 to answer the premises and show if
any they have why a decree should not pass as prayed
