

No. 6053. Verdict.

Joseph A. Weadde a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff being duly sworn and examined voir dire and said:-
My name is Joseph A. Weadde, my age 43 years I reside in Mechanicstown, Frederick County Md. I know the parties to this suit and am one of the plaintiff.

I know Henry Weadde late of Frederick County deceased. He was my father. He is dead. He died on the 18 day of December 1892 and left no will. He died seized and possessed of real Estate situated in Frederick County. At least of two parcels, one a house and lot in Mechanicstown and the other a tract of about 17 acres situated about 2 miles south of Mechanicstown with improvements on it consisting of a house and stable. The properties both together ought to bring from \$1100= to 1300=

I took at Exhibits Nos. 1 & 2 now shown me and they describe the said properties.

The said Henry Weadde left no widow surviving him but left the following Children and grand Children as his heirs at law viz:-

1. A son Joseph A. Weadde (present witness) whose wife's name is Ida.
2. A son Guyton S. Weadde, whose wife's name is Ella
3. A son John Weadde, whose wife's name is Flora.

6. A daughter Ella Stambaugh whose husband's name is Charles.
7. A daughter Martha S. Robinson whose husband's name is Charles.
8. A daughter Fannie Davis whose husband's name is Jacob.
9. A son Edward Weadde whose wife's name is Annie
10. The following grand Children, the Children of a deceased daughter Alice Goshon who died some years before his father viz:-
 1. Julia Kramer, whose husband's name is Eli Kramer.

 3. Elmer Goshon
 4. Margaret Goshon
 5. Eva Goshon
 6. Ella Goshon
 7. Walter Goshon
 8. May Goshon
 9. William Goshon

All the above named heirs at law reside in Frederick County in the State of Maryland except Ellen Stambaugh and her husband who lives in Carroll County Md, and John Weadde and wife and Frank Weadde and wife who are now residents of Md. the former living in Ohio and the latter in Pennsylvania; and all of them are adults over 21 years of age. Except Elmer Goshon Margaret Goshon, Eva Goshon, Ella Goshon, Walter Goshon, May Goshon, & William Goshon.

The said real Estate could not be divided among said heirs at law without great loss and injury thereto because part of it is town property and is too small to be divided into so many parts. I think it would be to the benefit and advantage of all of them and especially the infants to have said real Estate sold and the proceeds divided among them.
