

No. 6244. Equity.

(2.) That the said Anna M. Adams may be enjoined by order of your Honorable Court from proceeding with the execution of the power of sale contained in said mortgage.

(3.) That a trustee may be appointed by your Honorable Court to sell the real estate mentioned and distribute the proceeds among the Creditors of the said George B. Hamblet and the parties entitled in the order of their legal priority.

(4.) That your Orator may have such other and further relief as its Case may require.

And your Orator prays for the following process:-

That the writ of subpoena may be directed to the said Anna M. Adams, George B. Hamblet and Elizabeth Hamblet, his wife, all residing in Frederick County, Maryland, commanding them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some certain day to be named in said writ, and to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed herein, and that the writ of injunction may be directed to the said Anna M. Adams enjoining and restraining her and her agents and attorneys from proceeding with the sale of the property described in the mortgage granted to her by Elizabeth Hamblet and George B. Hamblet, her husband dated on the 9th day of August 1892 and recorded in Liber J. G. J. No 4, folio 331, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, until such further order as may be passed herein by your Honorable Court, And as in duty &c.
