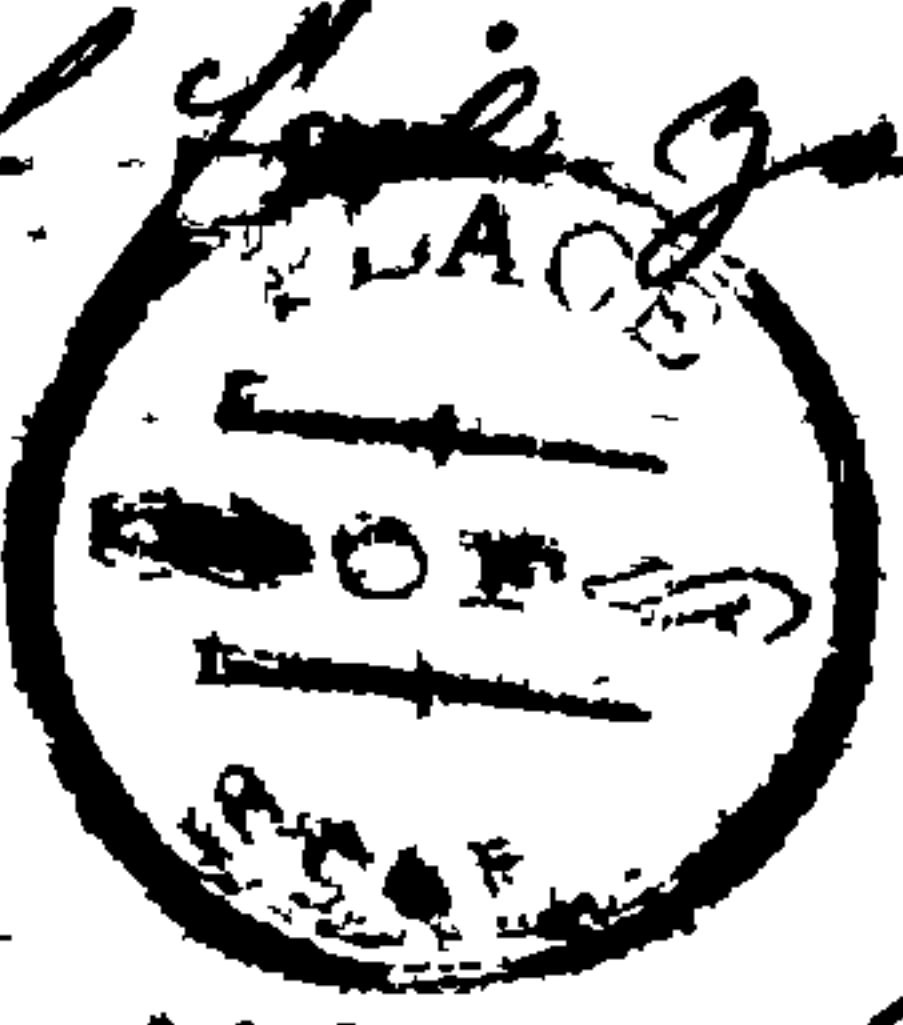


No. 6099 Equity.
