But during the life of my wife and daughter, or either of them, no change of investment shall be made without the consent thereto of the one alive, or of both of them if living, expressed in writing.

Twenty-fifth, I hereby constitute and appoint my wife, Frances J. Knight, and the said Enoch Pratt and Henry James, the executors of this my will, which hereby expressly revokes and annulling all wills by me heretofore made.

I declare to be my last and only will.

Twenty-fifth, I hereby limit the power given to my daughter under the tenth clause foregoing of this will, of devising a portion of Capital from which the income of three thousand dollars per Annum, mentioned in said Clause, shall be derived, so that she shall not give of such Capital more than ten thousand dollars in value to any one of my brother, sisters and their descendants, In witness whereof, I have, this second day of July, A.D. eighteen hundred and fifty-one. Hereunto subscribed my name, affixed my seal to this my will, executed in duplicate.
