Charles N. Schiltneck a witness of lawful age on the part of the plaintiffs being duly sworn and Examined deposes and says as follows:

My name is Charles N. Schiltneck, residence Burkittsville, Frederick County, Maryland, I know all the parties to this suit. I heard the testimony of Charles S. Bear and he correctly gave their names, ages and residences. I did not know Sarah Ann Fink in her life time. I know of her and know that she died about twenty years ago. I know the property in which she had a life estate and I look at the original deed marked Exhibit No. 1 in this cause that correctly described the property which upon her death vested in the children described by Mr. Bear in his testimony. Sarah Ann Fink died intestate and in my judgment the property is not susceptible of division amongst the parties and it would be to their best interest and advantage to have the same as a whole and the proceeds divided amongst her children according to their respective interests, the parties themselves being unable to agree to a sale amongst themselves.
