I, Perry J. Levy being in ill health and in view of the uncertainty of life, do make and declare this my last will and testament as follows:

Item, First, I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Antoinette, the house in which I now reside together with all the furniture therein contained of every description.

I also give and bequeath to her (\$2000) two thousand dollars in Bonds issued by the corporation of Middletown and known as water Bonds and I also give and bequeath to her (\$720) seven hundred and twenty dollars in Weekly Deposits in the Valley Savings Bank of Middletown. I also give and bequeath to her (\$2000) two thousand dollars, which is on Deposit in said Savings Bank.

Item, Second, I give and bequeath all of the remainder of my estate both real and personal, as follows (1/2) One half I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Antoinette, and the other (1/2) half to the children of my deceased son Charles.

And I hereby appoint my grand son Charles P. Levy as Executor of this my last will and testament made this 22nd Twenty second day of June 1896.
