The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill, answer, Exhibits, Testimony and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the contract of sale referred to in the proceedings is one that should be confirmed under Sec. 116 of Act 16 of the Code, it is thereupon, this 10 day of May in the year nineteen hundred by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the contract made in behalf of the defendants for the sale of their interest in the land mentioned in these proceedings be and the same is hereby certified and confirmed pursuant to Sec. 116 Act. 16 of the Code; and that Charles L.
