Bill of Complaint.

Bill of Complaint

4th That the complainants further represents that none of the said children now living are willing to take or want the said real estate on the terms of said will and that no power of Sale is contained in said will.

5th That your complainants further represents that by the said will an open road is reserved from the gate of Ed. G. Morrison to the Public Road at the N. E. Corner of the said parcel of land so long as the two farms conveyed to them the said Ed. G. Morrison and Wm. Morrison by said Wm. B. Morrison shall remain in the Morrison family.

6th That the complainant further represents that the said real estate described in Exhibits A, B, C. and D. consists of six and three fourths of land more or less improved by a weatherboarded dwelling house a stable and out buildings all of which are becoming out of repair and depreciating in value and no provision is made in the said will to keep the said property in repair or to pay the annual taxes and public dues or to keep the said property insured.

That the complainants further represents that the said Peniah Morrison is seventy four years of age and is becoming feeble and it is no longer safe to occupy the said property herself and desires that it should be sold and that it is to the best interest of all the parties in interest and especially the said Peniah Morrison and infants intended in the said real estate that the said property be sold and the proceeds of said sale be invested in good securities.

For the benefit of the said Peniah Morrison during her natural life and distributed among the heirs at law of the said Wm. B. Morrison after his death.

8th That the complainants further represents that the heirs at law of the said Wm. B. Morrison are Wm. Morrison and Helen Morrison his wife the complainant in this cause and Horriet E. Gilson whose husband is dead.

Ed. M. Morrison and Isabella Morrison his wife George M. Morrison and Susan Morrison his wife, Thomas J. Morrison and Elizabeth Morrison his wife W. N. Crabtree the husband of Elizabeth Crabtree she the said Elizabeth Crabtree died some time in January 1891, leaving surviving her, her said husband and the following children, William Crabtree, Thaddeus Crabtree, Alice Crabtree and Nina Crabtree all of the said parties are adults except Thaddeus Crabtree, Alice Crabtree and Nina Crabtree who are infants and under twenty one years of age and all of the said parties reside in Frederick County, State of Maryland except Thomas J. Morrison and Elizabeth Morrison his wife who reside in Washington D. C. and W. N. Crabtree and William Crabtree, Alice Crabtree and Nina Crabtree who reside in Carroll County, State of Maryland.

9th To the end thereof that the real estate may be sold under the decree of your honorable court and that the proceeds of said sale be invested and invested under the direction of your Honorable Court for the benefit of the said Peniah Morrison during her natural life and after her death to be distributed among the heirs at law of the said Wm. B. Morrison and that the defendants may answer the premises and that the complainants may have such further and other relief as the nature and equity of their case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your complainants the writ of Subpoena against the said Horriet E. Gilson, George M. Morrison and Susan his wife, Ed. G. Morrison and Isabella Morrison her wife Peniah Morrison all of Frederick County, State of Maryland.
