3. Thomas Landers whose wife's name is Miffie, and who reside in the District of Columbia,
4. George Landers, whose wife's name is Ella, and who reside in the State of Washington,

7th. The descendants of a deceased sister Margaret Baker formerly the wife of John Baker, to wit:-

1. Sarepta Neikent, a daughter, now the wife, of George F. Neikent,
2. Jane Hull, a daughter, now the wife of George H. Hull,
3. The Children of Sophia Laninger, a deceased daughter, formerly the wife of George Laninger, as follows:
  1. Luther Laninger, a resident of Pennsylvania,
  2. Elmer Laninger, whose wife's name is Fannie, both of whom are resident of the State of Pennsylvania,
  3. Marshall Laninger, a resident of Pennsylvania,

The Bill then prays for a decree for the sale of the real estate and that the proceeds be applied to the payment of the claim of the complainant and of all other creditors of William Cargrath who may come into the proceedings, and for general relief. The Bill then prays for process against the resident defendants and an order of Publication against the said Laura Fulton and Henry H. Fulton her husband Memis Lewis and Joseph Lewis, her husband, Alice Nicodemus, and Raster Nicodemus, James Baker and Virginia Baker, his wife, and Elizabeth Fox, and Frank Fox, her husband and all of whom are alleged to be nonresidents of the State of Maryland.

It is thereupon this 10th day of June, 1899, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity, and by the authority thereof, adjudged and ordered that the Complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once a week for four successive weeks prior to the Eleventh day of July, 1899 give notice to the said non residents of the object and substance of the Bill and warn them to be and appear in this Court on or before the 27th day of July, 1899 to answer said Bill and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed.
