To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity,

The Bill of Complaint of William J. Norman who sues for himself as well as for all other creditors who may come in and contribute to his expenses to this suit respectfully shows unto your honors:

1. That a certain George H. Herman late of Frederick County, departed this life during the month of April in the year Eighteen hundred and ninety one, intestate, seized and possessed of an interest in a certain tract or parcel of real estate situate in Frederick County, Maryland, which will appear by reference to a specified deed from Elizabeth Herman and Catherine Herman, to the said George H. Herman, which is filed herewith as exhibit, No. 1, to this Bill which together with all other exhibits (your petitioner prays may be taken and considered as a part hereof.
2. That said George H. Herman was at the time of his death indebted to plaintiff, by his promissory note bearing date, April 1, 1870, in the sum of \$187.28 by his promissory note bearing date April 1<sup>st</sup> 1886, in the sum of \$80.91, by his promissory note bearing date April 1<sup>st</sup> 1885, in the sum of \$88.60, by his promissory note bearing date March 21, 1882, in the sum of \$160, by amount of open account to April 1, 1877, \$68.20, all of which are filed herewith and marked exhibits Nos. 1-2-3-4-5.
- No. 3. That said George H. Herman left little or no personal property if any insufficient to pay the plaintiffs claim and upon which if any there has been no administration.
