The Bill of Complaint of Charles E. Geesey of Frederick County, Maryland, who sues as well for himself as for all the other creditors of John T. Geesey late of Frederick County, deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expense of this suit respectfully shows unto your Honors:-

- First:- That the said John T. Geesey, as, in his life time indebted unto Julian Wichter in the full and just sum of One Hundred dollars, by his promissory note bearing date December 16th 1896, which said note has been duly assigned by said Julian Wichter to your Complaint for value received, which said note is herewith filed and marked Exhibit "A" which, together with all other exhibits herinafter filed are prayed to be taken and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint.
