Geesey mentioned, in said mortgage for a sum largely in excess of said mortgage indebtedness, which surplus proceeds of sale will also be a fund in the hands of said savings institution and under the order of this Court available for the payment of any debts of John T. Geesey deceased.

6th. And these defendants further answering say that just prior to the filing of the Bill in this cause, they filed in your Honorable Court a Bill of Partition, being Equity cause No. 7103 praying for a decree for the sale of all the real estate of said John T. Geesey deceased, one of which parcels has been sold by said Savings Institution as above mentioned leaving two parcels as described in Exhibits B & C in this cause undisposed of, which said two parcels may be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court in said cause No. 7103 Equity without the additional expense to said estate of the costs herein incurred.

And said defendants have fully answered, pray that the Bill of Complaint of Charles E. Geesey against them and others be dismissed with cost.
