The Petition of William J. O'Brien Jr. Trustee, respectfully shows to your Honorable Court,

That by the provisions of the last Will and Testament of Harry P. Gallagher will have in hand a large amount of money, which will be to the provisions of the said will of the said decedent.

3rd. That Harry P. Gallagher, the infant son of Harry P. Gallagher, deceased by his next friend Frank W. Coale filed his Petition in Circuit Court No. 2 of Baltimore City, where said infant resides setting for the facts,
