

No. 7085 Equity.

The above cause being submitted for decree upon bill, answers, replications the testimony and report of Executor and the same being read and considered it is thereupon this 22nd day of September 1899 adjudged ordered and decreed as follows.

I.
That this Court hereby assumes jurisdiction over the further administration settlement and division of the estate of Jane M. Murray, deceased.

II.
That the division of the estate of Jane M. Murray reported by Edgar H. Gans, the Executor herein be and the same is hereby finally ratified and confirmed, That Frank Goode hold in severalty and not jointly or in common the two ground rents set apart for him in the Executors report filed herein; that Ignatius Goode hold in severalty and not jointly or in common the three ground rents set apart for him in the said executors report and that Frank Goode and Ignatius Goode, Trustees under the will of Jane M. Murray deceased hold in severalty and not jointly or in common with the other devisees the three ground rents set apart for said Trustees in said Executors report. And that all the rest and residue and remainder of said estate consisting of Real and personal estate in Frederick County, and four hundred and ten shares of the capital stock of the Louis M. Murray Banking Company and all indebtedness due from the said company to the estate be held by the said Frank Goode, Ignatius Goode, and Ignatius Good, Trustees in undivided shares of one third each as tenants in common.

III.
That the agreement of settlement heretofore entered into between the adult devisees and legatees of Jane M. Murray, deceased, and a certain John L. M. Dermott. be and the same is hereby ratified and approved and that one third of the money paid under said agreement to wit one third of four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4500.00) or fifteen hundred dollars be charged against the said Frank Goode and one third against the said Ignatius Goode and one third against the said Frank Goode and Ignatius Goode, Trustees.

IV.
This Court also assumes jurisdiction over the trust imposed by said will and agreement upon the safe Deposit, Trust Company of Baltimore and directs that the further administration of said Trust be had under the orders and jurisdiction of the Court.

V.
It is further decreed that the costs of these proceedings be paid by the Executor out of the Estate.
