Hagan in trust for the use and benefit of said Elizabeth Smith for and during her natural life, the interest thereon to begin to run at the end of two years after my decease and thereafter to be paid to her annually so long as she shall live and at her death the said sum of One thousand Dollars and any interest that may be due & unpaid to go to my said Grandson William Hagan, provided that in no event shall the principal sum be due and payable until six years after my death.

Both of the foregoing bequests to be charge and lien on the land devised to my son John C. Hagan in my said Last Will & Testament.

All provisions in my said Will in consistent with this are hereby revoked and annulled.

I am desiring peace among my children my will further is that if any of them or other legatees herein named shall refuse consent to the provisions of my said will & Codicil thereto and shall bring suit against my Executors or in any way contest the validity of said will & Codicil said person or persons shall have no benefit therein or thereunder.
